LEARNING PRAYERS BY HEART Infant – 6th Grade

As part of our Lifelong Faith Formation there are certain Catholic prayers that reflect the common language of faith in individual and community prayer. "In this way certain elements of the Catholic faith, tradition, and practice are learned for a lifetime, form a basis for communication, allow people to pray together in a common language, and contribute to the individual's continued growth in understanding and living the faith." (National Directory for Catechesis 29F).

The prayers listed in this document are common prayers that are widely used and prayed throughout the Catholic Church. We should strive to learn these prayers as a part of our Catholic heritage and faith. Learning them will be a process – we should strive to learn them by heart, however, we should not feel overwhelmed or burdened by the process. We can joyfully work toward incorporating these prayers in our daily prayer in the home, participation in the life of the Church and in intentional catechetical settings such as your faith formation lesson time.
